





MICROPLASTIC CONTAMINATION OF SEDIMENT AND WATER COLUMN IN THE SEINE RIVER ESTUARY

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• Scientific questions:

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- Is the estuary an accumulation zone of microplastics (MPs)?
- How does the MPs concentration evolve during a tidal cycle ?
- Does the salinity gradient impact the MPs distribution in the water column?



Microplastics and the Seine River estuary

Seine river estuary: Ο

- From Poses to Le Havre
- 170 km

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- Semi-diurnal tides
- Heavily industrialised \rightarrow Two industrial harbors

Petrochemical hub









o 2017–2019: 4 sampling campaigns

 3 sampling points along the estuary with different salinity gradient

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2017–2019: 4 sampling campaigns

 3 sampling points along the estuary with different salinity gradient

o Ebb tide

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Plankton nets used in the collection

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2017–2019: 4 sampling campaigns

- 3 sampling points along the estuary with different salinity gradients
- o Ebb tide
- Two plankton nets, 300 µm mesh size, collecting upper 15 cm (surface water) and 50 cm (subsurface water)
- Van Veen grab for sediment samples

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Water column contamination in literature

- Tamar estuary, England (Sadri et Thompson., 2014):
 0.74 particles.m⁻³
- O Guanabara bay, Brazil (Olivatto et al., 2019):
 - o 1.4 21.3 particles.m⁻³
- O Urban estuaries, China (Zhao et al., 2015):
 - o 136 249 particles.m⁻³

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Sediment contamination in literature

- Pearl river, China (Fan et al., 2019) :
 258 685 particles.kg⁻¹
- O Ebro delta, Spain (Simon-Sanchez., 2019) :
 - o 2052 particles.kg⁻¹

Discussion

Raman spectroscopy results for 25 % of water samples from the Seine River estuary

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 Between 10 % and 50 % particles did not respond or spectrum was not identified

 PE &PS contribute between 20 % and 45 % of the samples

• Vieux-Port: crystal PS microbeads

 μ FTIR spectroscopy results for 10 % of sediment samples from the Seine River estuary



Outcomes & perspectives

• Outcomes:

- High concentration of MPs in water column samples in the Seine River estuary
- Point-source pollution of crystal PS microbeads in Vieux-Port
- Same order of MPs concentration in sediment samples as in the literature
- Between 20 % and 45 % of PE & PS in water column samples
- > PVC found only in sediments



Outcomes & perspectives

• Perspectives:

- Increase the percentage of particles identified in each sample to increase the representativity of the results
- µFTIR for unidentified and no responding particles to increase percentage of identified particles
- Impact of salinity gradient on the MPs distribution in the water column
